Is there any affordability gap in Internet Access in Brunei Darussalam?

A) Types Of Internet Access

1. Dial-up Internet Access

- Uses modem to connect to the Internet
- Speed: from 96000bps to 56kbps
- Prior to the availability of broadband services

2. Broadband (ADSL) Internet Access

- Also known as ADSL (Asymmetric Digital Subscriber Line)
- Uses router and network card
- Speed: from 56kbps up to 124mbps (Up to 25x times faster than a standard 56Kbps dial-up modem)
- Benefits of ADSL
 - ✓ 'Always-On' Service
 - ✓ Phone / Internet Simultaneously

3. Leased Line

- Uses router and network card
- Speed: from 124mbps to 1.5gbps
- 4. Local wireless
- 5. ISDN (Integrated Services Digital Network)

B) Minimum Requirements To Get Connected

- 1. Computer system
 - ✓ **Processor** Intel Pentium running at 200 MHz or higher.
 - ✓ **Operating system** Windows 98 Second Edition, Windows Millennium Edition (Windows Me), Windows 2000, or Windows XP.
 - ✓ **Memory** 64MB of RAM for windows 98 n 128MB of RAM for Windows 2000, Windows Me and Windows XP.
 - ✓ **Display** Super VGA (800 x 600) or higher-resolution monitor with 256 colors.
 - ✓ Hard drive 75 MB or higher.
- 2. a) EITHER Modem (56kbps) using Telephone Jack from telephone port.b) OR Network card /wireless network card (10 / 100 kbps) using Ethernet Jack from router.
- 3. Phone line
- 4. Subscribe to local Internet Service Provider (i.e. BruNet or SimpurNet in Brunei) for Internet Access

C) Importance Of Being Connected

- Global advance towards an ICT world
 - ✓ Increase in Internet usage in the region & worldwide
- Essential for
 - ✓ Communications smtp/email, instant messaging, e-conference, forums
 - ✓ Education online courses, news/information on websites
 - ✓ <u>Business/money matters</u> e-commerce or e-marketing i.e. selling/buying products or shares; e-banking
 - ✓ Entertainment music, movies, games

D) Comparison Of Connection Rates Between Brunei & Other Coutries

- 1. Dial-Up Connection Rates
 - a) Standard rate per hour
 - b) Monthly subscriptions
- 2. Broadband Connection Rates
 - a) Monthly Charges
